A Shared Experience

What comes to mind when you hear the word *Pentecost*? Many people think of a mighty wind, tongues of fire and multiple languages. But Acts 2 begins with another detail that's just as key: Jesus' disciples "were all together in one place." Because they were together physically and spiritually, the early believers didn't miss the life-changing, world-changing birth of the Church.



The pandemic, while changing our definition of gathering, also highlighted our need for interaction. If Jesus' first followers hadn't been assembled on Pentecost, they would've missed the outpouring of God's power and the indescribable joy God had for them. Think about what believers today might miss if we neglect to worship with other friends of Christ. Who would want to miss God's blessings, promises and joy?

Loving an EGR

During a conversation over coffee, a friend mentioned an "EGR." I had to interrupt and ask for a definition: Extra Grace Required — in other words, people who can seem tough to love. Often, they're the most in *need* of love because they're hurting. Perhaps Jesus was referring to EGRs when he said, "If you love only those who love you, what reward is there for that? Even corrupt tax collectors do that much" (Matthew 5:46, NLT).



Truly loving others — even EGRs — might not be as tough as we think. Simple gestures such as smiling, truly listening, sending a note or extending an invitation go a long way toward expressing care and softening hearts.

At times, we all require extra grace. Thankfully, God has an unlimited amount to extend *to* us and then *through* us. Out of joy, we can find ways — even simple ones — to share God's grace and love with people who need it.

"I have called you by name, you are mine." Isaiah 43:1

It has been a tough year, actually over a year that we have dealt with this pandemic and all of the issues associated with it. We have had to navigate lockdowns, not being able to see family and friends, figuring out how to worship together even as we are apart. And even though things seem to be getting a bit better, there still is so much uncertainty that we have to deal with. And if a pandemic isn't enough, our nation has been in a bit of an upheaval for a while. There seems to be so much going on all of the time it makes one want to simply withdraw from it all. Added to all of this is the stress of daily living, many of us juggling more than we thought we could handle such as caring for loved ones, illness or other issues we might face on a day-to-day basis. As a result, our mental health has suffered. It is easy to feel helpless and hopeless under these circumstances. Some of you might be feeling very depressed or even suicidal.

This church is a place where I hope any who are feeling desperate or hopeless feel comfortable enough to turn to for understanding and help. We are here to remind you of God's love and God's promises and will walk with you through your struggles. You are loved, you are held no matter how dark the road. We all need to be reminded of that. One of the ways that we are hoping will help with your journey is a workshop that we will be offering that will help us discuss the difficult issues of mental health and particularly suicide. The workshop is for any who have had such thoughts, who love someone who has had such thoughts, who has died by suicide, or for those who simply wish to learn how to help. The workshop will be held May 19th: Youth session (ages 7th-12th grade) from 6pm-7:30pm and Adult session from 7:45-9:15pm. The workshop entitled "Soul Shop Workshop" will be held in the fellowship hall and is open to the community. In addition to the workshop, there will be prayer stations in the church along with people available for individual conversation and prayer. It is free and open to the public.

Our mission at United Lutheran is to help you find mental and spiritual wellness. Together as the people of God, we walk with each other on our journey, helping each other to see the presence of God surrounding us and the peace of Christ enfolding us.



The one who believes in Jesus is entrusted with the work of Jesus. That included Philip and James, apostles remembered today. And it includes you and me, and lots of other folk!




